"Eksaath – The Earth Foundation turns 3 this year – a number that we have been eagerly awaiting to reach. The past year has been a very fulfilling one.

Ek Saath Foundation is now the official NGO partner for the citizen movement "Carter Clean Up" which is currently in its 80th week having engaged over 7000 volunteers and cleared more than 25000+kgs of marine debris from the beach and mangroves. We also cleared more than 36,000kgs of construction debris which was then recycled and converted into benches, now placed on Carter Road Promenade.

Our Rackcham Material Recovery Facility in Himachal Pradesh which is being operated in collaboration with Healing Himalayas is now on road to becoming self-sustainable having processed nearly 3.5 tons of waste in the second half of 2022.



We have also launched our Eco Shiksha initiative in collaboration with other NGOs to include solid waste management and environmental awareness as part of the curriculum in civic schools.

In the year 2023, we plan to actively work in the fields of wildlife rescue & rehabilitation, waste management, and reforestation. The next 12 months look very exciting and we look forward to the able guidance of our Advisory board members and our founder Pragya Kapoor."

Our Projects

Carter Clean-Up

Ek Saath foundation in partnership with the initiative partner Carter Clean-Up group joined hands to completely eradicate waste from Carter Beach and Mangrove and make it a waste-free zone.

Started with 5 members – Harold Fernandes, Ashwin Malwade, Nupur Agarwal, Freishia B and Maansi Ahuja, today Carter Clean Up is a group of 500+ working for 80+ weeks.

C&D waste was sent to MetroWaste Handling Pvt. Ltd. for recycling. It was converted into 5 benches, which are now installed at the Carter road beach Promenade.

Sustaining Paradise

"Cleanliness is next to Godliness," hence it is crucial for Himachal to stay the paradise it is. Ek Saath foundation in partnership with Healing Himalayas has undertaken a Material Recovery Facility to sustain the Himalayas or 'Devbhoomi', the land of God.

Our Rakchham Material Recovery Facility (as part of the Sustaining Paradise Project) in Himachal Pradesh that is being operated in collaboration with "Healing Himalayas" is now on road to becoming self sustainable.

The facility processed nearly 3.5 tons of waste in second half of 2022.

Ek Saath is glad to share that at-source waste segregation at our MRFs is 100%.

Further, this collected dry waste is segregated into 10 categories at the MRF and then sent for recycling. Through rigorous awareness campaigns and consistent waste collection practices, our safai saathis have managed to build trust. On daily basis, 1.5 to 2 tons of household and commercial waste is collected.

Way forward

Ek Saath aims to start similar such MRF's in tier 2 & 3 cities of Maharashtra in the year 2023. Sustaining Western Ghats – will be aiming at eradicating waste

Mission Green Punjab - Ludhiana

In collaboration with Eco Mela Team, Ek Saath foundation has successfully managed to raise awareness on waste management and environmental crisis.

- The native species plantation is now a year old after surviving the harsh cold weather.
- The clean-up drive at Sidhwan canal has finally reached the government and Sidhwan cleanup has started in full force with a complete ban on throwing any garbage in the canal. There is a proper barricading of the water body in progress.
- We have also conducted forest clean up drives in collaboration with Eco Mela and Indian Green Army.

Leaving Green Imprints -A Tree Plantation Initiative

Ek Saath foundation has started a tree plantation drive to create mini forests in urban and rural spaces.

India has agreed under the Kyoto Protocol to increase the area under Forest cover to 33% of the total Land area by 2030.

In contribution, Ek Saath aims to engage corporates and citizens in accomplishing this goal, using the dense plantation method. By 2024 we wish to engage 20+ corporates and plant 1 lakhs+ trees in India.

Young minds are the future of the country. Thus, in collaboration with schools, Ek Saath conducts 'Solid Waste Management Awareness' drives for school children. Our aim is to create awareness about waste among kids and help them practise waste segregation at school and home.

We also wish to make these schools waste banks where kids drop their dry waste for recycling . This collected waste will be monetised and picked up by a recycler. We aim to expand our awareness program and reach out to more schools and colleges.

Project Kooda

Ek Saath foundation in collaboration with Young Creative production has started the "Swachh Kokari Sundar Kokari" Mission, in Wadala, Mumbai. We aim at turning the slum settlement into a waste free complex through awareness, clean up drives, waste segregation, dry waste monetisation and over all development.

We have conducted a 2 month long survey in the settlement, knowing the people and their problem. Additionally a clean up drive is conducted every Sunday, along with our 10 on ground volunteers.

We have been working along with the F-North ward BMC officials, helping them implement a better waste management System.

Wildlife Rescue and Rehabilitation

In the year 2023, we plan to actively work in the fields of wildlife rehabilitation, and waste management with awareness and reforestation. We plan to engage with multiple NGOs working in the field of Wildlife across Maharashtra and Goa. We aim to provide them with secondary support such as rescue equipment, ambulance. thermal medical drone cameras, etc. and additionally create waste management centres for adjoining villages.
